I visited MSU under the project scholar programm from 13th April – 12th May 2018. While at MSU. I gave a seminar on Climate change and its implications on soil and crop management in the Department of Agricultural Food and Resource Economics (AFRE).

I also interacted with 16 faculty members, visited 5 other agricultural research centers and sat in on post graduate lectures.

A visit to Soil Science Laboratories was facinating. I was amaized at the number of laboratries I saw. The equipment was modern, expensive, reliable and accurate. The labs were well structured and organised. The total number of sub laboratries under Soil Science were 10: Comprising of 1 General Lab, 5 Chemistry Labs, 2 Soil Pyhsics Labs and 2 Soil Microbiology Labs. Apart from the general lab, all the other labs were linked to each other for easy accessibility and contact during research activities.

The lecture halls were more than enough, both small, medium and larger ones were installed with modern teaching aids compared to what is obtainable at my university.

Visits to some research centers, like Kellogg Biological center, show that they are being use both as a research center and as a commercial center for crops and animal production.

I now understand better the conditions by which a university could be referred to as an "Academic center of Excellence". Hence MSU is an Academic Center of Excellence.

My experience/insight from the the visit arround campus show that research activities are colloborated among diverse









researchers in different fields while faculty members are not over loaded with teaching assignment.

I learnt that departments and colleges are headed by chairpersons and deans respectively while meetings are called periodically at the two levels.

The visit has been very rewarding, professionally encouraging and fullfilling. The good posture of MSU which makes it an academic center of excellence will be taken back to my country university "University of Agriculture, Makurdi, Nigeria"
