Number of Awards Given	One Recipient (may only win this award one time)
Application ProcessNomination narrations are accepted through September at the 4H office. Market are due at the October Horse committee (one vote per club adults by adults).	
Type of Award	A plaque and name added to the plaque in the 4-H office.

Jr Golden Feedbag Award

Requirement to Apply	Ingham County 4-H horse member ages 13-19 who demonstrates Outstanding service to the Ingham County 4-H Horse Program
Number of Awards Given	One recipient
Application Process	Nominations are accepted through September at the 4-H Office. The member is nominated in 100 words or less ballot. Ballots are voted on at the October Horse committee by their peers. Recipients are announced at the Horse Awards Banquet.
Type of Award	A plaque and name added in the 4-H office.

Barn Award	
Requirement to Apply	Horse Clubs choosing to decorate their barns compete based on daily scores relating to interaction with people at the barn, team work and cleanliness.
Number of Awards Given	The club receiving the highest daily score earns the daily ribbon. One club receiving overall combined highest score from all four days at Fair will be awarded a plaque,
Application Process	Participants sign up at the fair.
Type of Award	Daily Ribbon at the fair. Certificate for top score at the 4-H Horse Award Banquet.

Flamingo Award

Requirement to Apply	Created in the memory of Brenda Curtis goes the one who displays the best sportsmanship attitude and grace under pressure in the gymkhana speed classes.
Number of Awards Given	The judge will decide who the recipient will be.
Application Process	Members who have entered and show in gymkhana classes at fair.
Type of Award	A flamingo trophy and is presented at the end of the show on Saturday.

Paul Lang Memorial Overall Gymkhana Championship

Requirement to Apply	Awarded to the 4-H member with the Highest overall Point total from, speed events during Achievement Day 1, Achievement Day 2 and the Ingham County Fair.	
Application Process	Entries for Achievement Day 1, Achievement Day 2 and the Ingham County Fair.	
Type of Award	The winner will be presented with a certificate during ceremonies on Sunday at the fair and receive their award at the banquet in January.	

Senior Ceremony		
Requirement to Apply	4-H members in the horse project who are graduating seniors	
Number of Awards Given	All 4H horse project members who are graduating seniors.	
Application Process	The high school graduates write a short story sharing their 4-H career and goals for their future. This story must be typed and submitted at vet check.	
Type of Award	The graduating seniors are honored at Fair in a riding ceremony led by the Ingham County Mounted Division, on Tuesday in the 4-H south arena.

This award is intended to promote participation in all aspects of 4-H, at club, county and state levels, with recognition given to community service, leadership, promoting 4-H, recordkeeping and overall 4-H participation, as well as participation in the 4-H Horse Program.

The Ingham County 4-H Horse Committee will present an educational award and a gift to the top scoring horse project member in each of the following categories:

- X first year 4-H and Horse Project
- X first year in 4-H Horse Project, and 2 years/up for other projects
- X two and three years in Horse Project
- X four to six years in Horse Project
- X seven years and over in Horse Project

Applicant must be a 4-H Horse Project member in good standing for at least one project year (September through August of the year the award is applied for) and 9 - 19 years old (4-H age). Horseless Horse Project members are eligible to apply for this award.

- The current project year is considered from September through August.
- Categories are cumulative unless otherwise indicated-count <u>all</u> activities that are described for all years that the member has been in 4-H.
- A member may not qualify for points in <u>each</u> and <u>every</u> section! That is not counted against them.

Members apply for this award by <u>completing this form and</u> <u>turning it in to the 4-H office by 5:00 on September 30.</u>

This form must be reviewed **and signed** by the Horse project leader.

4-H'ers may win this award once in each category.

Interviews may be given if the point spread is five or less among high point individuals or at the discretion of the selection committee. Categories marked with an asterisk (*) will be used as tie-breakers in case of interviews.


